# Scott Foresman Reading Series

Scott Foresman Reading Street © 2008 is an all-new scientifically research-based reading program, adopted district wide for Grades 1-3 (2008-2009 school year), Kindergarten and Grade 4 (2009-2010 school year) and finally Grade 5 (2010-2011). Reading Street is designed to help teachers build readers through motivating and engaging literature, and a wealth of reliable teaching tools. The program provides lessons for differentiating instruction with a strong emphasis on continual progress-monitoring and an explicit plan to help teachers manage instruction for small and large groups of students.

Reading Street includes a "golden" collection of award-winning literature with an even balance between fiction and nonfiction materials. The program features funny stories, scary stories and real-life adventures! Because unit selections are grouped around a weekly thought-provoking question, each selection connects and expands the concept to build deeper understanding. One story perfectly leads to the next-one concept is explored from many sides-children have enough time to think about a *big* idea, learn, and enjoy. Students are exposed to a broad range of topics and genres. Every selection in Reading Street emphasizes a science or social studies concept. Frequent reading and discussion of nonfiction material will help readers develop their ability to process informational text.

In addition, Reading Street prioritizes the 5 core areas of reading instruction:

- ✓ Phonemic Awareness
- ✓ Phonics
- √ Fluency
- ✓ Vocabulary
- ✓ Comprehension

By assessing these key predictors, we can ensure student success.

Reading Street provides teachers with a variety of lessons for the classroom that target the individual needs of their learners. The program includes Advanced Readers, On Level Readers, and Strategic Intervention Readers. The series also includes a specific intervention program called My Sidewalks (grades 1-5) and Early Reading Intervention (Kindergarten) which offers instruction for some students who require more intensive support.
